

Beauty from Another Era

Built from 1902 to 1904, the Grand Hotel of San Pellegrino Terme is an Italian Art Nouveau hotel situated in the eponymous town.

The brainchild of engineer Luigi Mazzocchi and architect Romolo Squadrelli, the Hotel has an architecture close to the French Tuileries Palace: the structure, characterised by a central crown dome, has a majestic appearance.

Among the illustrious guests of the Grand Hotel: the Queen of Italy Margherita of Savoy, on the occasion of the inauguration, the composer Pietro Mascagni, family of the Tsar of Russia, the Nobel Prize winners Eugenio Montale and Salvatore Quasimodo, the director Federico Fellini.

The atmosphere is reminiscent of the Belle Époque period: the sumptuously decorated interiors have bucolic and floral themes. The decorations depict flowers, leaves and bunches of grapes, suggesting a contamination with the outside world and a return to nature, in contrast to the process of industrialisation.

The weaving of natural materials, already present in the 1920s when the hotel was in its "golden age", reflects the original ornaments and motifs.

Today the Grand Hotel is closed and after a conservative restoration process is looking for a new purpose to return to its former glory.

Welcome to a place where time seems to stand still, a beauty from another era.




Entrance Hall

The delicate colours in shades of green reflect the surrounding vegetation.








The use of biscuit-coloured rattan skin warms up the surroundings, which are dominated by icy shades of blue.




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
