

Rattan and rattan core are harmoniously inserted into the environment, favoring the dialogue with the outside space, already in place thanks to the large windows that flood the spaces with natural light. Among the peculiarities of these natural materials is their versatility: in some rooms the material shows its veins, thanks to light aniline stains. In other rooms, lacquers and vivid colors enhance the graphic aspect of the pieces, adding rigor to the sculptural shapes and weaves.




